YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO GENDER EXPRESSION.

For trans, non-binary, and gender-diverse youth, the First Amendment grants the right to express your identity and speak up for yourself in the face of discrimination and prejudice.

Regardless of your assigned sex at birth, you have the right to:

- · wear clothes that match your identy,
- be called by the name and pronouns you choose,
- · use the restroom and locker room that matches your identity,
- play on the sports team that matches your identity, and
- attend school dances/functions the way you want.

THESE RIGHTS ARE PROTECTED BY FEDERAL & STATE LAWS.

YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO BE SAFE AT SCHOOL.

If you attend a public or charter school in Delaware, school officials are obligated to protect you. You have the right to

report harrassment, the right to privacy, and the right to not discriminated against. This includes things like

misgendering or being outed.
